

## Our History

The Sisters of St Joseph arrived in Cygnet in 1896 and began teaching local children at St. Mary's School (on the site of the current *School House Coffee Shop* building).

On the 6 March 1922, a new red brick building was officially opened providing the Sisters with access to classrooms. The Sisters taught in the red brick building until 1955. This building is currently still in use at the College as the Early Learning Centre.

In 1944, the Christian Brothers arrived in Cygnet with the aim of establishing *Lourdes/Hill Agricultural College*. The College consisted of fifteen acres used as an orchard with small crops and grazing areas. The Brothers taught boys from Year 5 upwards, in the red brick building. In 1955, six new classrooms where constructed, the Sisters moved their classes into the new rooms where they taught girls and junior boys.

In 1973, St Mary's School and Lourdes Hill Agricultural College were combined. Following in 1976 the first lay Principal was appointed following the departure of the Brothers and the school was then known as St James' Convent School and later St James College. Since 2009 the College is known as St James Catholic College.











### Our Faith

St James Catholic College values the Catholic tradition and faith, as a community we teach the Gospel values and closely follow our founder's Sisters of St Joseph and Blessed Edmund Rice charisms.

At St James Catholic College, we promote a quality faith-based education, which allows us to maintain close links with the local Catholic Parish of the Huon Valley, other Catholic Schools and the wider community. Students will be encouraged to develop their spirituality through Prayer, reflection, Liturgical celebrations and other activities.

Students at the College are invited to take part in the Parish Sacramental Program, St Vincent de Paul group as well as many opportunities to explore their faith, through action and support of others, particularly those in need.

The Board supports the College Mission Statement and is dedicated to upholding the Catholic ethos and values of our College.


#### PARENTS & FRIENDS COMMITTEE

# Kindergarten

St James Catholic College Kindergarten is the perfect place to start your child's learning journey.

Our wonderful staff provide your child with a learning environment that is engaging, educational and fun. Students in Kindergarten spend the day using play as the basis of their learning and together work hard to develop skills including counting, drawing and writing, cutting and manipulating equipment and well as respecting each other and building friendships.

All of the fun activities in Kindergarten help to develop the skills children will need throughout their schooling life.

Our quality program is designed for students aged from four years of age and is held on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays each week (term time only) from 8.40 am - 3pm.











## Primary

St James Catholic College Primary school, Prep to Year 6 offers a safe, nurturing environment for the development of literacy, numeracy and positive social skills as well as creative and practical experiences which together build engaged and resilient learning.

Small class sizes and committed, experienced staff ensure that individuals needs are prioritised and learning support and extension provided as needed. Music, LOTE and HPE are delivered by specialist teachers.

Our rigorous curriculum is supported by innovative learning activities. Subjects offered to students align with the Australian Curriculum including English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Social Sciences, Health and Physical Education, LOTE, Music, Art and Drama, additionally students undertake Religious Education.

To support student development the College offers a dedicated pastoral care program integrated through our F.L.A.M.E.S (Faith, Learning Attitude, Mutual-Respect, Encouragement and Safety).



















## Secondary

St James Catholic College Secondary school Year 7- Year 10 offers students a supportive and inclusive environment focused on the individual learning needs of the student.

The College endeavours to provide students access to learning opportunities that encourage innovation, the use of imagination and the development of sound inquiry skills.

All Secondary students are required to undertake the following Australian Curriculum subjects: English, Mathematics, Humanities, Science and Health & Physical Education. Students are also required to undertake Religious studies.

In Years 7 and 8 students also undertake the following 'taster' subjects: Art, Digital Technology, Food Studies, LOTE, Music and Workshop.

To complement core subjects, Year 9 and 10 students at St James Catholic College are offered the following elective subjects:

#### SWPBS

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support Systems (SWPBS) is a systems approach for establishing the social culture and behavioural support needed for a school to be an effective learning environment for all students.

#### Its features include:

- Explicit teaching of positive social expectations;
- Clarity about what those expectations are;
- Acknowledgement and rewards for appropriate behaviour;
- Consistent consequences for unacceptable behaviour;
- The use of data about behaviour for decision-making.

At St James Catholic College our expectations regarding school-wide positive behaviour are contained within our FLAMES acronym. Students are expected to demonstrate values and attitudes that promote...



### Enrolment

#### **ENROLMENT CRITERIA**

St James Catholic College is established to serve the needs of Catholic families. If there are places available, all Catholic applicants will be accepted.

To be considered for Kindergarten enrolment your child must turn four years of age on or before the 1st January in the Kindergarten year. The following order of criteria is used for the overall process of acceptance:

- Catholic students from Catholic schools;
- Siblings of Catholic students currently in St James Catholic College or those who have progressed through to other Catholic schools;
- Siblings of non-Catholic students attending St James Catholic College or those
  who have progressed through to other Catholic schools, provided that they are
  attending a Catholic primary school currently;
- Any Catholic student not attending a Catholic school, other than those in the above categories;
- Siblings of non-Catholic students currently in St James Catholic College, or those who have progressed through to other Catholic schools, but who have not attended a Catholic Primary School;
- Any non-Catholic student from within the Catholic primary schools, other than those in the categories above;
- All other applicants.

#### **ENROLMENT PROCESS**

After being provided with a Prospectus, parents are encouraged to contact the College to arrange a meeting with the Principal and a School Tour.

Parents are required to return the Student Enrolment Application Form and other associated forms prior to commencing at St James Catholic College.

On receipt of the 'Student Enrolment Application Form, the College will review the application and if successful send an acceptance letter to families.

#### **Accounts**

Accounts are forwarded to families as per the details provided on the enrolment form. The annual fee and general levies are invoiced at the commencement of the school year and can be paid by equal monthly instalments from February to November or by arrangement with the College Business Manager.

#### **Sibling Discount**

Discounts are available to parents who have three or more children, in Catholic schools within Tasmania. Discounts are applied in accordance with the Tasmanian Catholic Education Commission School Fees Assistance Policy.

The discount rates are:

3 children 10% discount on tuition fees

4 children 20% discount on tuition fees

5+ children 30% discount on tuition fees

## Our Uniform

The wearing of correct uniform maintains and enhances the very positive image that the School enjoys in the wider community and is important for students in the development of respect for themselves and the School. Every student enrolling at St James Catholic College is expected to adhere to the School's uniform policy and to wear their uniform with pride during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when engaged in school activities out of school hours. This policy is developed by the School and College Advisory Board and there is an expectation that parents/carers will enable their son/daughter to be in School uniform every day at School.

Summary of uniform expectations for students:

- to wear the College uniform in the correct manner as per the Uniform Policy;
- to wear the College bucket hat during Terms 1 and 4;
- to wear their ties correctly;
- to have their hair is tied back and groomed neatly extreme styles or dyeing of hair are not permitted, e.g. undercuts, dreadlocks, rat-tails, less than no. 3 cut and unnatural colours;
- to wear regulation school and sports shoes;
- no visible piercings are permitted with the exception of one earring in each ear-lobe;
- no additional items of clothing or accessories are to be worn;
- to use a school backpack which is not to be graffitied in any way;
- Girls are permitted to wear a simple ring, and are not permitted to wear makeup; coloured nail polish.
- Shorts/skirts/tunics are to be of a reasonable length;
- Boys must be clean shaven at all times.

It is the expectation of the College that parents will:

- provide their child with the correct uniform;
- ensure that their child wears the uniform correctly;
- provide a note of explanation when their child is unable to wear the correct uniform.


In 2019, the minimum requirement for a student iPad is an iPad Air or newer. Older devices will not be an acceptable option. If you need to purchase a new iPad, the 2018 6th Gen, 9.7inch, iPad is the recommended option.

#### BYOD Levy (hire)

If an outright purchase of the iPad creates financial hardship for families, there is an opportunity to pay a device levy of \$120 per year to the College. If you wish to access this option, please contact our Business Manager, Kelly Du Bois to discuss this option further.


